Acts 1:9 Now when He had spoken these things, while they watched, He was taken up, and a cloud received Him out of their sight.

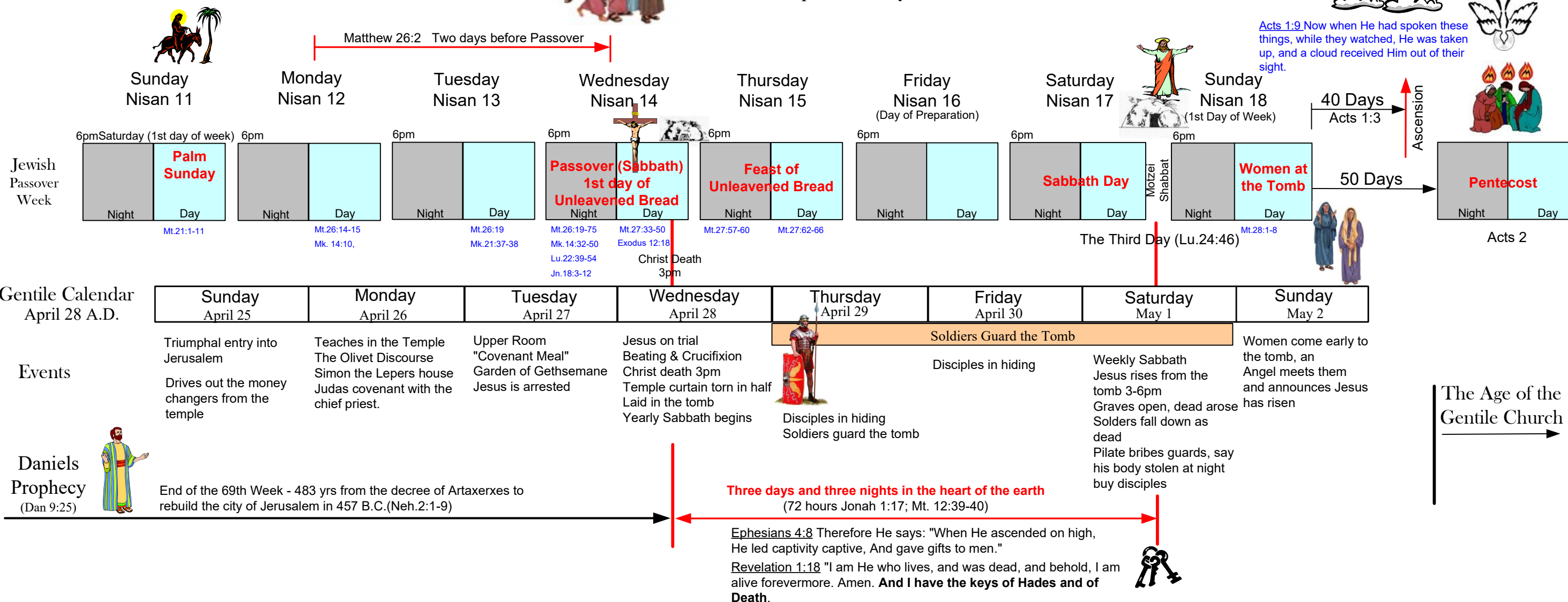

"Now the feast of unleavened bread drew nigh, which is called the Passover" (Luke 22:1).

Fest of Unleavened Bread included Passover, a one day observance of the killing of the passover lamb which was eaten in the evening, the begining of Unleaven Bread (Nisan 15). This Feast lasted 7 days, (8 including Passover), Nisan 15-21.
